Classes are presented by a team of qualified lecturers, comprising of hoof care professionals, vets and musculoskeletal therapists who are all highly regarded in their respective fields and know what hoof care parameters and management strategies work.

From hoof science to sustainable hoof protection, workplace safety and running a small business, the Diploma of Equine Podiotherapy is the complete hoof care education package.

Graduates are highly regarded in the equine industry and due to constant demand for their professional services, they are able to quickly repay their investment in this course.

The course is designed to be delivered in six on campus blocks which will be completed over 12 months. The first block will be 7 days long while the following five blocks are 5 days long. Following each block, there are assignments to be completed before a student can attend the next block. A case study portfolio is to be completed within 1 year of the final on campus block. There is flexibility to complete this course over a longer period of time.

Location: The college campus is based at Mayfield, 470 Middle Creek Road, Yarck in picturesque North-East Victoria. Mayfield is a 1000 acre cattle, sheep and horse breeding farm which also offers retirement agistment and has a lameness rehabilitation centre that specialises in laminitis recovery. The campus provides a comfortable airconditioned classroom, student amenities, accomodation and camping facilities. There is also a full range of off-campus accomodation within easy driving distance.



Fees: The full fee for the Diploma of Equine Podiotherapy includes tuition, textbooks, course notes and amenity fees. It does not include accommodation.

The total fee for the Diploma is \$8000 and is GST free. This includes a \$1000 non-refundable but transferrable deposit. There are payment plans available.

Course prerequisite: Provide First Aid (HLTAID011) To be completed independently before commencement of the course.
